Social Security card issued by the Social Security Administration (other than a card stating it is not valid for employment) 2. Certification of Birth Abroad issued by the Department of State (Form FS-545) 3. Certificate of Report of Birth issued by the Department of State (Form DS-1350) 4. U.S. Birth Certificate (original or certified copy) 5. Native American tribal document 6. U.S. Citizen ID Card (Form I-197) 7. ID Card for use of Resident Citizen in the U.S. (Form I-179) 8. Unexpired employment authorization document issued by U.S. Department of Homeland Security (other than those listed under List A) 		

Federal Employees: Federal employees may use U.S. federal employee identification cards to establish employment eligibility and identity under the provisions of this security directive. A second form of government issued ID must be presented for Fingerprinting and ID services.

Non-U.S. Citizens: Applicants **must** provide their Alien Registration Number or Non-Immigrant Visa for Fingerprinting and ID services.

U.S. Citizens Born Abroad: Applicants **must** provide their U.S. Passport Number, DS-1350 (U.S. Birth Certificate of applicants born abroad), or Alien Registration Number (if applicable) for Fingerprinting and ID services.
